- 1 Which of these is a licensing objective?

- 2 When preparing its Statement of Licensing Policy the Licensing Board must consult:

- 3 If an applicant for a licence is **convicted** of attempting to influence a Board member, the Board may:

4	<b>A</b>	4.1 State the Licensing Board's duty to establish a local licensing forum, the forum's general functions, and the constitution and proceedings
5	<b>C</b>	5.1 State the general functions of the Licensing Standards Officer in relation to the Licensing Board and the local authority, their powers of entry and inspection and the training requirements
6	<b>A</b>	6.2 - State the procedure and documentation required for a premises licence application, the applicant's duty to notify the court of convictions, and the procedure of further application after refusal
7	<b>C</b>	12.1 - State what a personal licence is, what it entitles the holder to do, its prescribed form, period of validity & the law in relation to the application for a replacement personal licence following theft, loss etc
8	<b>C</b>	13.1 - State the duty of a personal licence holder to notify the court if charged with a relevant offence or the Licensing Board if convicted
9	<b>B</b>	14.1- State the law in relation to the sale of alcohol and other age related products to an underage person, the delivery of alcohol by or to an underage person and unsupervised sale of alcohol by under 18s
10	<b>A</b>	15.1- State the law in relation to drunkenness and disorderly conduct on licensed premises
11	<b>C</b>	17.1 - State the law in relation to licensed hours
12	<b>C</b>	19.1- State the nature of alcohol, strengths of alcoholic drinks, key facts and common myths about alcohol
